All restrictions have been rescinded. The storage is full for the winter and drawing from the river is continuing to keep it topped up through the winter.

PREPAYMENT OF TAXES AND UTILITIES

We will once again be offering discounts in January (5%) and February (4%) for prepayment of taxes. Please contact the office in January to find out the amount needed to pay for you specifically. Utility prepayments will also be taken for residential properties. The payment amount is \$412.50, which results in one month free of water distribution, sewer and garbage fees. Utility prepayment is only available in January. Those that have not paid their 2024 taxes, a penalty of 12% will be added on January 1, 2025.


